#### **Safeguarding**

As we lead up to the Half Term holiday, this period can also provide a time and opportunity to reconsider the arrangements that you agreed upon in relation to online activity within your households.

#### **Ground Rules**

- Discuss together as a family how the internet will be used in your house. Consider what information should be kept private (such as personal information, photos in school uniform etc) and decide rules for making and meeting online friends. Ensure you discuss the risks of accepting friends' requests from strangers online and be curious about what your child is doing online, much like you would be with regards to their offline decisions.
- Discuss using strong passwords with your daughter/son so they understand how they can protect their online accounts. Talk about keeping passwords safe by not sharing them with anyone or using the same password for several accounts. If your child's account is "hacked" or compromised then make sure they change their password and report any concerns or suspicious activity. - Consider locating all computers and laptops in a family area. Your daughter/son is likely to accessing the internet on mobile phones, games consoles and tablets so be aware that you may not be able to supervised them at all times. You need to teach safe behaviours and build trust at the same time.
- Be especially aware of settings rules relating to your child's use of webcams and any applications or devices which allow voice or video chat. #### **Help in Hard Times**

##### **Is your child eligible for Free School Meals?**

You could be missing out on what you're entitled to: over £400 of meals per school year **and** reduced price school visits and swimming. St Peter's will also benefit because the Government directs specific funds to schools through the "Pupil Premium". The measure they use to allocate the Pupil Premium to schools is children registered for free school meals. If your child is eligible but doesn't wish to eat school meals, they can still be given a packed lunch from home.
